

REPRESENTING TEXAS' FIRST DISTRICT



Congressman Nathaniel Moran serves the seventeen counties of the First District of Texas in the U.S. House of Representatives. He attended West Point for two years before transferring to Texas Tech University, where he ultimately earned a B.A. in Russian, an MBA, and a law degree.

Congressman Moran began his elected public service as a member of the City Council for the City of Tyler, Texas from 2005-2009. In 2016, he was appointed as the Smith County Judge, and then subsequently elected to a full four-year term in 2018. He continued in that role until he was elected to Congress in November 2022.

In the House of Representatives, Congressman Moran serves on the Judiciary Committee, the Foreign Affairs Committee, and the Education and the Workforce Committee. As a freshman Member, he was also appointed by the Speaker of the House to serve as the U.S. Chairman of the Transatlantic Legislators' Dialogue, one of the longest and most intensive inter-parliamentary relationships in the history of the European Parliament or the U.S. House of Representatives.

Congressman Moran resides in Whitehouse, Texas with his wife of 25 years, Kyna, and their four children.
